EVOLUTION & GROWTH PERSEVERANCE AND ADAPTABILITY DURING A TIME OF TRANSITION

During the 2021-22 fiscal year, Storycatchers Theatre continued to navigate the ever-changing environment created by the pandemic while conducting a search for a new leader for our healing-centered creative youth development programs. Following the departure of our remarkable founder, Meade Palidofsky, in August of 2021, we took the time to reconceive the role of artistic director. This required a thorough, thoughtful approach, and I am proud of the result. In August of 2022, we hired Lee Peters as Storycatchers Theatre's first Director of Arts Education Programs. Lee brings a wealth of arts education experience to Storycatchers, and I can't wait to see how our phenomenal teaching artists will flourish under his leadership.

As you will read in the following pages, those exceptional teaching artists have continued their unflagging support of youth at all stages of court involvement. No matter where we meet them in the system, Storycatchers is always ready to provide support while amplifying and elevating the voices of young people who have important stories to tell. And while helping them tell those stories, we also prepare them to envision and pursue futures of their own choosing.

Storycatchers Theatre envisions a system truly dedicated to justice. We work to ensure that every young person impacted by the carceral state has sufficient resources to bloom and grow.

COMMUNITY NEED

At Storycatchers Theatre, we dedicate all of our resources to meeting the needs of adolescents and young adults who have been impacted by the carceral state.

We recognize that the carceral state includes but is not limited to formal incarceration. A carceral state encompasses overarching ideologies and practices that lead to tangible and intangible practices that shape and organize society in highly discriminatory ways. The adolescents and young adults with whom we work have predominantly grown up in communities shaped by decades of structural racism, government disinvestment, and generational poverty. They have enormous potential but face numerous, complex obstacles that they should not have to navigate alone.

We first began working with youth in secure facilities in 1990, and our methodology evolved in direct response to their desire to share their stories. In the years since, one thing has remained clear – these are stories that deserve – and demand – to be heard.



IMPACT ON INCARCERATED YOUTH

During the past year, our access to in-person engagement steadily increased. The Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice restored our access to the Illinois Youth Centers in Chicago and Warrenville, and our teaching artists joyfully resumed in-person sessions – barring the occasional Covid-19 outbreak. While the Cook County Juvenile Detention Center remained closed to nonessential personnel, our allies there worked diligently with us to ensure ongoing remote engagement. In the past 12 months, we have been able to resume live performances for small groups at Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice facilities while working with the youth at the Detention Center to generate recordings and written anthologies of youth-created scenes and songs. We share our partners' commitment to the health and well-being of detained and incarcerated youth and anticipate ongoing resumption of inperson activities while exploring digital alternatives as needed.

Our Changing Voices jobs program employs young people returning home to Chicago in a creative youth development, job readiness curriculum. The program was designed to employ groups of 21 youth for 30 hours per week in eight-month increments. Since March 2020, we have adjusted the enrollment period and reduced the number of youths employed in each cohort to mitigate the limitations imposed by the pandemic.


Each Changing Voices ensemble member commits to the creative process while learning critical life and job skills and leaves our program with individualized action plans to pursue next-step employment and/or education opportunities. During the 2021-22 program year, Changing Voices graduated two separate cohorts, one in September 2021 and the other in June 2022.
